



Treatment & medication

Clonidine

Other names: Catapresan®, Dixarit®.

What is it?

A medicine that is given to treat pain.

- It is important that this medication is taken according to the schedule.

What does it look like and how is it given?

- A tablet or drink that is taken by mouth (oral).
- A clear liquid that is administered as an infusion into a vein (intravenously).

Specifics

Clonidine is often combined with another painkiller.

Side effects

- Dry mouth or pain in the mouth
- Low blood pressure
- Dizziness when getting up, sleepiness, drowsiness
- Headache
- Gastrointestinal complaints such as nausea, vomiting and constipation
- Nightmares and/or seeing things that are not there (hallucinations)
- Depression

Special instructions

- If your child vomits within 30 minutes after taking the medicine, please check prinsesmaximacentrum.nl/regimens under the heading 'Medicine' to see what you should do.
