Itraconazole

Other names: Trisporal®.

What is it and how does it work?

A medicine that is given to prevent fungal infections.

What does it look like and how is it given?

A solution that is taken by mouth (oral).

Short-term side effects (within 24 hours)

- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain
- Coughing, fever
- High blood pressure
- Inflammation of the mucous membranes

Long-term side effects

Skin rash

Special instructions

Your child may not eat or receive tube feeding from one hour before to one hour after taking the itraconazole solution.

Specifics

Blood will be sampled regularly to check whether your child is receiving the correct dose.
